VABC Bookmaking in 2012

The VABC is a community of print, paper, and book artists from throughout central Virginia. The bookmaking group welcomes everyone who is interested in bookbinding and making books.

Workshops and other activities

The VABC holds formal bookmaking sessions approximately 10 times per year. All are open to VABC members and non-members. Novice bookmakers are welcome.

Formal sessions. In 2012 the formal sessions will usually be held on *the second Saturday of the month*.

- **Workshops/Classes.** Taught by specialists and more-experienced members, these sessions are usually three to four hours long; registration and a fee (slightly higher for non-members) are required.
- **Field Trip.** Once each year, the group visits an institution involved with bookmaking. There a small donation is requested to offer a small gift to the host.

Informal sessions. Bookmakers often meet informally on Wednesday evenings (5:30-7:00 p.m.) or Sunday afternoons.
